Hopefully when this newsletter reaches your home, the snow is either almost gone, or completely gone. It seems this winter just does not want to end. As we look forward to spring and summer, the Town will be busy repairing the effects from winter – from roads and ditches to equipment and facilities.

A major project that will be anticipated to start in late May will be the complete replacement of the Cheese Factory Road bridge as well as elevating a section of the road to reduce the chances of flooding in the future. A meeting is scheduled for April 8, 2013 at 6:30 pm to review the proposed plans and

timeline.

The town is working on obtaining a grant via the Oneida County Tourism Bureau to try and bring a night of entertainment in the Wilderness Park like years past. The goal is to bring a family style event. Look for additional information in future newsletters and our website.

The Town Board will soon be going out to bid for renovations to the interior of the Municipal Building. The ceilings, floor coverings and heating and ventilation are all in need of repair and replacement. The board has chosen McDonald & Monterose as the architect of record for this project.

Finally, it appears

from the comments and cars in the parking lot, that the trail system this winter received a lot of use. We will be completing the final connection this spring by constructing a bridge over the creek connecting the back trail system to the front. The Highway Department has been tasked with the responsibility of this job and has been doing a great job.

Grievance Day

Every year the Town has Grievance Day on the 4th

Tuesday of May.

This year Grievance Day is scheduled for May 28, 2012. You can be heard from 1-3 & /or from 7-9 P.M. The only assessment that may be reviewed (grieved) is the

assessment on the current tentative assessment roll completed by the local assessor. As a general rule, a separate complaint should be filed for each separately assessed parcel.



From the dog corner:

Hello neighbors! We are about to enter what I term the "Active Season" as opposed to spring, summer and autumn as they all have the same animal trouble spots. There are many of these problems that reoccur year in and year out, thus I am giving you an abbreviated list of the usual problems and what to do about them. Let us commence:

All dogs must be leashed unless within a fenced yard. Invisible fence counts as legal fencing. All dogs must be licensed. Owners walking dogs must clean up after them or face a sizable fine from the town court.

Barking dogs that are outside a residence and barking longer than 45 minutes may be reported to dog control as a nuisance. Dogs barking within a residence cannot be reported.

If you are bitten by a dog seek medical attention if the skin is broken. Medical personnel will report the bite to the Oneida County Department of Environmental Health to insure the rabies vaccination status of the biting animal and order it confined.

Feral cats are considered to be wild animals and will not be accepted at the Humane Society. If you are having problems involving them, call me and I will give you options to deal with them.

No town resident may take a stray dog or cat to the humane society. You must call me to arrange for them to be accepted. If you keep a stray longer than five days you are considered to be the legal owner of it.

Wild animals and their offspring: in particular skunks, ground hogs, raccoons and foxes frequently will be on lawns or around homes as they prepare to leave the mother animal. They will often be seen playing or feeding in the daytime. This is normal behavior and usually they will move on as they mature. Aggressive or stuporous animals may carry rabies, distemper or have mange. The DEC should be called or the sheriff's department if the animal needs to be put down. Stay away from it. Along with the above listed animals this also includes rabbits and any bat on the ground.

Large wild animals including black bears, bobcats, coyotes, fishers as well as the ubiquitous deer, turkeys and Canada geese are all found in our town. If there is a problem with any of these creatures you must contact the DEC.

Wild or domestic dead animals are the sanitation department's responsibility if they are in the road. If they are on your property, you are responsible for removal options.

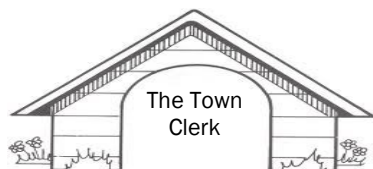
Animal abuse or neglect reporting depends on the animal. If it is an owned dog or cat it should be reported to me. If it is an agricultural/farm animal it can be reported to the S.P.C.A. offices in Syracuse, it is the closest one to Deerfield.

Put tags on your dog's collar and put the collar on the dog! If your dog strays without its tag's neither I nor anyone else can return it to you. If it is taken to the humane society that cost to retrieve it is \$20.00 a day. Further, you cannot get it back if it is not currently licensed. If this happens on a weekend you could be looking at an \$80.00 fee, plus the cost of the license. 80% of missing/lost dogs without tags are never returned to their owners. This is a painful loss that is easily avoided with proper identification.

Invisible fence can be a boon or a disaster. Dogs within the fence view it as real and will often challenge dogs on the other side. These other dogs may be loose or may be walked by their owners near the fence. There are numerous incidents of challenged dogs crossing into the invisible fence area and severely injuring the inside dog. Do not leave your dog out in the area when you are not at home.

These are just the highlights of the most common difficulties. You can call me about any animal problem be it wild, domestic, agricultural and it can include insects, amphibians, reptiles or birds. I will get back to you and help. Have a good "active season"!

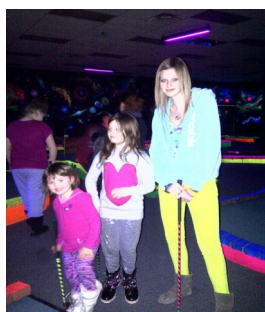

Note from the Youth Director

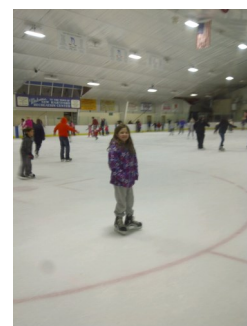

The Highway Department hopes everyone is doing well after what we hope is the end of the winter season. The highway department will be out as soon as possible when the weather permits to try and finish projects leftover from last year.

Spring cleanup will be starting as soon as the weather permits. The highway department will be out fixing plow damages, sweeping streets, picking up sand piles, picking up brush piled up separate to be chipped and leaves left from the fall months.

As many of the town residents may know the town board and the highway department have moved to a new Green Waste collection plan last year. The town purchased a used compactor truck for green waste collections and trash collections. Material for green waste should be put in reusable containers weighing no more than 50 lbs. each. Brush should be piled separate with the butt ends facing the same direction to ease the pick-up by the highway crew for chipping. **PLEASE DO NOT PUT ANIMAL FECES IN YOUR GREEN WASTE WE WON'T COLLECT IT. NO GREEN WASTE OR TRASH MAY BE PUT OUT UNTIL 48 HOURS BEFORE THE COLLECTION START DATE. WE WILL ASK YOU TO REMOVE IT FROM THE CURB. Please mark the green waste dates on your calendar we won't come back until the next month after we have gone by.** Green Waste can always be brought to the Highway Garage anytime.

The highway department will again this year have the Saturday trash collections at the fire house and at the highway garage. The first Saturday collection is on **April 27 at the Firehouse** on Trenton road please note this date. The other Saturday dates are **September 14** at the Firehouse and **October 26** at the town garage. The Highway Department will also have curb side trash starting on Monday May 20. There are some new changes in the trash collection process; the town is no longer accepting electronic waste as trash from the curb side. We will accept electronic waste at the Highway Garage or at our Saturday drop off sights for recycling. The Oneida Herkimer solid waste will accept electronic waste at no charge on Leland Ave. in Utica. The dumpsters are available at the highway garage during our normal working hours 6am to 4:30pm please call ahead to schedule an appointment.

The Town and the Highway Department have a very busy year planned. The Highway Department will be working on road projects and some normal road maintenance such as ditch cleaning and removing high shoulder buildup for better drainage. If any of the town residents have any drainage problems along the right of way please call the highway garage at 826-7014. We will put you on our list and get to you as soon as possible.

The Town of Deerfield along with all the other towns in Oneida County are working With Oneida County Soil and Water Conservation District. The Soil and water district is in the process of gathering information to rewrite the five year Hazard Mitigation plan for Oneida County. All Towns need this to be eligible for FEMA money should we have a disaster. The planning committee has a survey out to get information from the public you can get a copy from the website [www.surveymonkey.com/s/Oneida Co Hazard](http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/Oneida_Co_Hazard) Mitigation Plan Update Survey or a hard copy from Highway department. There is also a link from the Town Of Deerfield web site under Highway I will be updating the website with information about things the highway department will be doing around town. The Highway Department

The Highway Department will be starting spring clean-up about the third week in April, weather permitting. Spring clean-up consists of: repairing plow damage, branches that have fallen throughout the winter months, leaves that fell late after the leaf pick-up was done.

The Town's green waste collection will take place once per month May through October.

- Reusable containers (plastic or metal) containing clean green waste may be put out during the scheduled collection times.
- Containers may be put out for collection no sooner than 48 hours before the scheduled collection date.
- Each container should not exceed 50 lbs.
- Brush and tree limbs must not exceed 8' in length and ends facing the same direction.
- Green waste is defined as grass, brush, leaves, and also small plants.
- The Highway Department will also pick-up stone and concrete pieces at the same time. Please keep this material separate from other green waste.
- Once the Highway Department has gone by we won't be coming back until the next month, so please mark the dates down on your calendar.

After the last green waste collection in October, leaves can be piled loose at the curb to be vacuumed up with our leaf machine. Please do not mix anything in with your leaves as this could damage the machine, or worse, someone could get hurt.

Remember, town residents can bring any of the above items to the highway garage anytime throughout the year and put material in the designated spot.

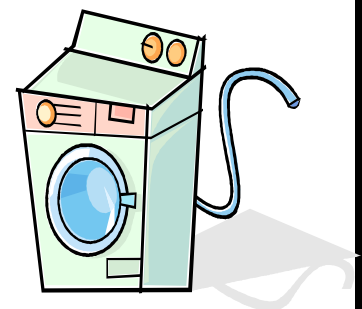
Failure to follow the above directions could result in the town not picking up the material or an appearance ticket for non-compliance. Thank you for your cooperation.

WHITE GOODS



If you have a refrigerator, freezer, or air conditioner that you would like disposed of please stop by or send a check to the Town Clerk's Office. Please make checks payable to the "Town of Deerfield" for \$10.00. We will then call the Highway Department and ask them for a pick-up date. We have to charge you because the Solid Waste Authority charges the Town \$10

for white goods that contain Freon. Any other large items without Freon will be picked up by calling the Highway Department at 826-7014.



2013 INSTRUCTIONS FOR DISPOSAL OF GREEN WASTE, HOUSEHOLD TRASH, RECYCLABLES, AND OTHER ITEMS

DATES & INSTRUCTIONS FOR GREEN WASTE

May 6th, June 3rd, July 1st, August 5th, Sept.3rd, Oct.7th

The Deerfield Town Highway Department will be picking up per these instructions:

Green Waste, grass clippings, leaves, weeds, etc. will be picked up at curbside from May through October (See schedule above) **IMPORTANT: NO BAGS. MANDATORY-GREEN WASTE NEEDS TO BE IN CONTAINERS, ie plastic trash can.** Please keep limbs and green waste separate. Limbs can be up to 8 feet in length and do not have to be tied **BUT** need to be piled neatly and left at curbside, **NOT** in ditches. Trees larger than 6 inches in diameter must be disposed of at the owners expense. Trees & brush cut down by a contractor must be removed by a contractor.

DATE FOR CURBSIDE PICK-UP: Starting May 20, 2013

Dates for Trash Drop-Off at the Firehouse: April 27 & September 8, 2013

Date for Trash Drop-Off at the Highway Garage: October 26th

Other Items: Furniture, mattresses, rugs, etc. will be picked up once this year starting May 20th, or larger items can be picked up during the year by calling the Highway Department at 826-7014.

HOUSEHOLD TRASH LIMIT: 4 cubic yards (12' x 3' x 3')

White Goods: Stoves, washers, dryers, hot water tanks, etc. will be picked up only by calling the Highway Department at 826-7014. Refrigerators, freezers & air conditioners, *SEE Refrigerators & Items containing freon. (below)

Special Items: the Town Highway Department **will not** pick up ELECTRONICS, tires, batteries, and used oil at curbside pick-up. Batteries, tires and used oil may be brought to the Solid Waste Recycling Center, Leland Ave. Extension on Saturdays from 10am until 2pm. (There is a charge for tires.) Your private hauler may pick up tires. Residents can bring electronic waste to Highway garage or the recycling center on Leland Ave.

Residential Construction & Building Materials: are accepted from the homeowner. A limit of two (2) wheelbarrow's full are accepted during curbside pick-up. You can also bring it to the Highway garage.

***Refrigerators & Items containing freon:** There is a \$10.00 charge for white goods containing freon. Examples are: refrigerators, freezers, and air conditioners. Payments & pickup arrangements can be made at the Deerfield Town Clerk's office. Make checks payable to "The Town of Deerfield". Or you may choose to dispose of your gas-containing appliance yourself by taking it directly to the Waste Recycling Center, Leland Ave. Extension where a certified specialist can remove the gas for a \$10 fee.

NOTE:

- ♣ Any dog, cat or animal feces found in green waste, or any other bagged waste picked up by the Highway Department will result in termination of future pick-ups at that residence.
- ♣ Do not put any items out earlier than 48 hours from the dates of the pick-ups listed, or you could be ticketed.
- ♣ It is illegal for unauthorized individuals to disturb any curbside trash piles in the Town of Deerfield.

Your Private Hauler has the obligation to pick up the following recyclables:

Paper: All newspaper, magazines, junk mail glossy catalogs, brown grocery bags, corrugated cardboard, boxes used in bulk packaging, paper towel tubes and backs of paper pads. Boxes may be flattened or folded, but not torn into small pieces. The inside of some boxes are not recyclable-paper and plastic liners should be removed as well as plastic carrying handles.

Aluminum & Metal Cans: Beverage cans and food containers must be rinsed.

Glass & Plastic: Plastic recyclable codes: 1,2,3,4,5 and 6. All containers must be rinsed clean; labels may be left on. Glass from window, windshield, or light bulbs must be placed in designated bags purchased from your private hauler.

FROM THE BUILDING INSPECTOR

If you are thinking of building, renovating, altering, changing or whatever you want to call it- Ask the Building Inspector if you need a building permit. New York State has their building codes, the town also has zoning codes that HAVE to be complied with. It is for your safety as well as your families.

The Building Inspector is available most weekday mornings. Please call before you come. The Codes Enforcer is available Monday-Friday from 10am-noon.

Their number is 724-0413, ext.22 for Building, and 34 for Codes.

DON'T FORGET-
Pools need a building permit, as well as the fencing around them.

TRANSIENT MERCHANTS & PEDDLERS



The Town of Deerfield enacted, in 1996, Local Law No. 2 regulating transient merchants and peddlers. The Law was amended in 2009 strengthening the requirement that all merchants and peddlers selling wares in the Town of Deerfield must obtain a peddler license issued through the Town Clerk's Office.

An application has to be filled out and accompanied by a photo ID. On this application they need to list their name and address plus the name and address of the company they are representing. We have them list the car & license plate number of the car they will be using.

Licenses issued by the Town will have picture ID copied onto it. Always ask to see the peddler's license and picture ID. If the peddler can not show a valid peddler license, you should not allow them to remain on your premises or enter your home.

You can contact the Town Clerk's Office, 724-0413, ext 23, to verify the issuance of a valid peddler's license. You may also contact the Oneida County Sheriff Department at 736-8364.
